Everyone's Literacy Volunteer - Essex Libraries

Support or lead literacy based sessions for customers. This could be through anything from guided reading sessions, phonics sessions, creative writing sessions, or any session that would support raising literacy standards in our customers.

When: Flexible The role covers a range of activities the timings cannot be specified. It can be noted that each course will have regular timings over a set period of weeks

Where: Libraries throughout Essex

The Role: Volunteers will be given the contact information of a member of library staff who is their main contact. The local Community Connector team will also be available to support volunteers throughout on the projects. You will receive induction, a welcome pack and specific training for your volunteering role. This may be shadowing or an occasional training session or just talking through what's involved. There will be ongoing support from local library staff. If you are running your own course, you will need to provide your own materials. If you are running a course of our own design, we will support you with course materials, such as plans and resources.

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Work Party Volunteer - Essex Wildlife Trust

Would you like to spend time outdoors with like minded people from your local community? We are starting a brand new monthly Saturday work party and a weekly Tuesday work party in addition to our current Wednesday weekly group.Roding Valley Meadows reserve is the largest remaining species-rich water meadow in Essex with its famous display of wildflowers and wonderful mosaic of habitats consisting of wildflower meadow, floodplain meadow, hedgerow, scrub, ponds, fen and woodland. Cattle graze on the reserve throughout spring and autumn months.

- When: The work party meets on the first Saturday of the month and weekly on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The sessions run between 10:00am and 14:30 pm. We take a morning tea beak and stop for lunch. You are not required to stay for the whole session if you need to leave early..
- Where: Roding Valley Meadows Nature Reserve, Grange Farm Centre, Grange Farm Chigwell, Essex IG7 6DP
- **The Role:** In the summer months volunteers help with tasks such as hay making, fencing, path maintenance, litter picking. Winter tasks involve coppicing, hedge laying, scrub management, and invasive species removal. The work party is a great way to get outdoors, meet new people and learn new skills whilst helping nature flourish.

Volunteers may be asked to assist & support young people with a variety of small group

activities or outings whilst at the group.

When: The Maintenance Volunteers mainly meet on Thursday mornings 9:00 to 13:00.

Where: Bedford House, 4 Westbury Rd, Buckhurst Hill IG9 5NW

The Role: Maintenance Volunteers will assist the Caretaker with light maintenance and caretaker's tasks in general. It is helpful to be more than one person to do a piece of work such as one holding and the other drilling, mending items, painting, set up and remove chairs, or sweeping the front car park. If you have experience in DIY that is helpful, but DIY experience is not a requirement to be a Maintenance Volunteer.



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Toddler Group Helper - Restore Community Church

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Activity Group Helper - Essex Children and Family Wellbeing Service Barnardo's

In partnership with Essex Child and Family Wellbeing Service & Barnardo's – our services protect, supports, and nurtures the UK's most vulnerable children. We help bring out the best in children – no matter who they are or what they have been through. Our volunteers help make this happen.

- When: Monday-Friday Required approx. 3 hours per session
- Where: Brambles Family Hub and Delivery Sites in Epping, Loughton, Waltham Abbey Districts
- **The Role:** Assisting staff with planning and organising group activities, which take into consideration age, abilities, and interests of members.

Setting up group activities in advance and clearing away afterwards. This might include preparing refreshments/snacks, organising the layout of the room, preparing resources, and tidying the room after the group.

Assisting children and young people to improve their self-confidence, develop social skills and build positive relationships. Role modelling positive behaviour and interactions during sessions.

Collating and evaluating feedback from children, young people, and parents.



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Community Speedwatch Volunteer - Safer Essex Roads Partnership

Community Speed Watch Groups consist of volunteers from their local community, who all share the same concerns about speeding through their local villages. These volunteers are from all walks of life, with a variety of skill sets and knowledge, who give up their free time to assist with the Vision Zero aims of reducing the number of fatalities and serious injuries on our roads, caused by speeding, and create a visible presence to alert drivers that speed is a leading cause of road traffic collisions in Essex.

- When: Volunteers are required for approximately an hour per day. These times may vary but would be mutually agreed. No evening work is required.
- Where: Throughout Essex
- **The Role:** No qualifications are required. There is a minimum age of 18 but there is no maximum! Volunteers must be passionate about assisting their local communities to be safer for all, helping to reduce speeding in their villages, thus reducing fatalities and serious injuries. Volunteers from all walks of life are welcome. Training and ongoing support is provided



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
